

TRANSFERRING POT PLANTS

A little preparation 1-2 weeks prior to move day will keep your potted plants thriving long after your move.

- Prune back any excess foliage where possible.
- Tie/bind together any branches that overhang their respective bases.
- For the transportation of large plants/trees that are potted in ceramic terracotta pots, it is strongly recommended when travelling interstate that plants be removed and bound with hessian/plastic, ensuring roots are protected. This will allow for the separate packing and therefore safer transportation of the pots.
- Give plants a good soaking with water at least two days prior to the move day to ensure adequate drainage time.
- Where possible, smaller/hanging plants should be packed into transit packs prior to removal. This ensures ease of handling and best possible protection. Larger plants will be handled by our removal crews on the day of move.

- Transfer plants to be moved into a designated area to avoid risk of being overlooked on day of uplift.
- Quarantine regulations differ across all Australian states and territories. Therefore, it is highly recommended that the relevant state authorities be contacted to ensure the correct procedures can be adhered to. These authorities include:
