## 1

### Contact your electrician

Contact a licenced electrician to get a quote and arrange the connection. Make sure your electrician submits an Electrical Work Request (EWR) to Energex.

## 2

### Contact your retailer

Call your electricity retailer and make sure they submit a Business to Business (B2B) request to Energex.

## 3

### Complete the Application Form

Once your meter has been installed by Energex, complete your Reward Application Form online at [www.energex.com.au/positivepayback](http://www.energex.com.au/positivepayback)

You'll receive your **\$250 reward** within six weeks of processing your application.

# Connect to Economy Tariff 33 and save...

Pool pumps are among the most energy-hungry appliances in a home, costing on average \$640\* annually to run.

With the availability of energy efficient pool pumps and Economy Tariff 33, your pool needn't be draining your bank account. By making a few simple changes, you could substantially minimise your pool running costs.

Take a look at the table on the right to see how much you could save.

## Myth:

Your pool pump needs to be hardwired to Economy Tariff 33.

## Fact:

In the past pool equipment had to be hardwired to Economy Tariff 33. Nowadays the connection is made via a general power point. This ensures your pool professional can carry out pool maintenance as required.

## Making the connection

Simply contact a licenced electrician and ask for a quote to connect your pool pump to Economy Tariff 33. Your pool pump will be connected to Economy Tariff 33 via a power point that we will connect to an economy rate electricity meter (free of charge).

Although you'll incur an initial charge from your electrician to connect to Economy Tariff 33, you could be eligible for a \$250 reward and up to \$300\* in savings each year. If you calculate your savings over the lifespan of your pool pump (seven years), that equates to \$2,150 in savings.

## Myth:

Setting your pool timer to filter outside peak times will save you money.

## Fact:

While filtering outside peak times helps reduce peak demand, it won't result in savings. You'll need to arrange for your electrician to connect your pool pump to Economy Tariff 33 to save on your running costs.

## Top Tip



If you have upcoming electrical work to complete at home, talk to your electrician about connecting your pool to Economy Tariff 33 at the same time. Also, consider connecting your hot water system to an economy tariff to save even more.
